



TOWN OF St. JOHN
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MEETING OF MAY 13, 2024

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Webb. Councilmembers Bezdicek, Hamshar, and Smick, Public Works (PW) Steven Engles and Steve Gibson, Century West’s Matt Morkert and Hunter Carroll, and the Town clerk attended the meeting.

The April 22, 2024 meeting minutes were read and approved as read.

The payables were presented to the Council for their review and discussion. The payables were moved by Bezdicek and seconded by Hamshar—a motion carried by a vote of the Council.

Century West gave an update on the wastewater treatment plant. They are pushing ahead and have a June completion date for the Design. The existing clarifier will be used for the high flow/emergency overflow/problem with the pumps.

The Manhole Plan has been 98% completed and with review by Public Works and SJ Environmental, it will be ready to send off to Diana Washington at Ecology.

Century West has been in contact with the school and they have been approved for a contract and should be able to get a bid out for the roof drainage project done.

Century West has also moved the monitors in the system to collect data from other areas.

The Clerk asked for approval to post a date change for the May 27th Meeting. This falls on Memorial Day. The council approved the regular meeting date change to Tuesday, May 28 with a motion from Smick and seconded by Bezdicek.

The Museum asked the council if the Peter Smith Family Picnic on May 25 could use the Meeting room for an overflow of lunch. The Smith Family may have two cars parked at the park overnight for car camping for the event. No objections were given.

Discussion on council replacements was discussed. The council will continue to contact individuals to find interest.

The Summer Dayz Car show and Show and Shine porta potties were discussed. St John Auto Body has a company that they are setting up with for the June Date. The Council agreed to split the cost as porta potties are needed for Show and Shine downtown.

South East Washington Economic Development Association (SWEADA) renewal was discussed. It was moved by Bezdicek and Seconded by Smick to renew the membership. A special check will be written before the next meeting.

Residents at 410 S Main are concerned that with the new meter they will be paying more for services and feel that they will no longer be willing to maintain the Town right of way. After discussion, the council agreed that this is no different than any other right of way and it is the homeowner's responsibility to maintain it.

No request for additional comments was stated. It was moved by Mayor Webb, seconded, and unanimously agreed to adjourn. The Meeting was adjourned at 7:32 PM.
