MEETING OF MARCH 11, 2024

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Webb. Councilmembers Bezdicek, Hamshar, and Hinds, Public Works (PW) Steven Engles and Steve Gibson, and the Town clerk attended the meeting.

The minutes of the February 26, 2024 meeting were read and approved as read.

The payables were presented to the Council for their review and discussion. The payables were moved by Hinds and seconded by Hamshar—a motion carried by a vote of the Council.

Residents on Willson Lane requested a road sign. Public Works will look into it.

Public Works gave an update on the road projects and quotes. Priority projects are Chip Sealing Highway 23 up to Main, and Crack Seal Park. Additional work may be able to be done by Public Works to lower the cost of some projects including alley work and drainage.

The quote for new windows in the shop was discussed. Approval was given by a motion from Hinds and seconded by Bezdicek to go ahead and order the new windows for replacement.

The Rialto liquor license is up for renewal. After discussion, the council agreed there were no objections to renewal.

The residents of 7 N Park would like to put up a 20x30 building. Discussion of easement for utilities and the current setbacks ensued. An updated easement will need to be signed by all parties involved. Discussions with the Postal Service, Doctor's Office, Conservation District, and Peg's Place will need to happen.

Surplus items were discussed. The clerk will look into where advertisements must be placed and Public Works will come up with minimum bids. After discussion, the council agreed

to put a package deal together for three items. It was moved by Bezdicek and seconded by Hamshar to move forward with a Surplus sale.

Two used vehicles were found for Public Works. Used 2015 Ram 3500 with utility box and a 2018 Chevy 3500 with dump box. After discussion, the council agreed to progress on the purchase through email for negotiations before the next council meeting. A motion was made by Hamshar and seconded by Hinds to have Bezdicek negotiate a possible deal.

No request for additional comments was stated and it was moved by Mayor Webb, seconded, and unanimously agreed to adjourn. The Meeting was adjourned at 7:49 PM.
