



TOWN OF St. JOHN
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MEETING OF AUGUST 14, 2023

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Webb. In attendance were Councilmembers Bezdicek, Hamshar, Hinds, Smith, and the Town clerk.

The minutes of the July 24, 2023 meeting were read and approved as read.

The payables were presented to the Council for their review and discussion. The payables were moved by Hinds and seconded by Smith. Motion carried by a vote of the Council.

The clerk gave the council a list of addresses that receive letters concerning their trees, bushes, and other items in the roadways and alleys. Some residents have already taken care of the items hanging or protruding into the roadway and alleys. Some residents do not believe they are responsible for the upkeep of the right of way and state these are not their responsibility. The council discussed possible ways to take care of the overhang and etc. The topic will be revisited.

The council was given the quote to fix well #4. After a brief discussion, a motion was made by Hamshar and seconded by Hinds to go ahead with the repairs. Letters will be sent to residents on the affected line about the water shut-off when the repair is scheduled.

The clerk brought up the issue of 6 S Jennings. The owners were told that approved inspections would need to be done in order for a resident to move into the rental. The owner was in agreement and assured the Mayor they would follow what the town wanted to get a renter in the residence. They were very anxious to get someone in though. The clerk was able to find that the owner applied for an L&I electrical permit, but it was not the correct one and two other permits are required as this is a mobile home. According to Dawn at L&I new permits have not been requested. At the time of the meeting, the clerk had not heard back from the owner in regard to an APPROVED electrical permit from L&I. The town's building inspector has not completed an inspection nor has he approved residency of the property.


Public Works applications were reviewed and after discussion, the council agreed to call an applicant for an interview. The interview will be set up for August 28 at 6 PM.
