



TOWN OF St. JOHN
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MEETING OF MARCH 25, 2024

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Webb. Councilmembers Bezdicek, Hamshar, Hinds, and Smick, Public Works (PW) Steve Gibson, Century West’s Matt Morkert and Hunter Carrol, and the Town clerk attended the meeting.

The minutes of the March 11, 2024 meeting were read and approved as read.

The payables were presented to the Council for their review and discussion. The payables were moved by Hinds and seconded by Hamshar—a motion carried by a vote of the Council.

Century West gave an update on the progress of the new Waste Water Treatment Plant. The architect has changes that will incorporate more of what Public Works and SJ Environmental are looking for in the new plant and will have new plans to review in mid-April. Century West requested an amendment to the scope of services listed in the WWTF project. The amendment will not result in additional costs to the town but an increase within the scope of the project to include the additional services within the budgeted amounts. Approval to accept the amendment was given by a motion by Smick and seconded by Bezdicek.

Matt updated the council and public works on the additional data requested by Ecology for the administrative order. Public Works will work on getting pictures of every manhole and a description of the condition and repair work needed for each manhole.

Public Works discussed the surplus vehicles. They have the orange Tractor running and have decided to not surplus it and the accessories it has along with the Nissan pickup. The white Ford will still be considered for surplus at a later date.

The mayor has talked with all but the Dr. Office regarding the alley between the post office and the conservation office. A plan will need to be made a little later this spring.

Discussion on the 2015 Ram and 2018 Chevy ensued. After discussion, it was concluded that even though the Chevy was a good deal the dump truck was not emergent. Public Works

could use the money for something else that was more urgent. They will continue to watch for a price drop or a better deal.

No request for additional comments was stated, and it was moved by Mayor Webb, seconded, and unanimously agreed to adjourn. The Meeting was adjourned at 7:37 PM.
