

MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 23, 2019

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Webb. Council Members Bezdicek, Hinds, Smick, and Smith were in attendance. Also attending were Amy Watt and High School Ag Instructor and students, Suzanne Schmick, Dan Cunningham, and Skip Colyar

The minutes of the September 9, 2019 Meeting were read and approved as read.

The payables were presented to the Council for review and discussion. The payables were moved by Hinds and seconded by Smith. Motion carried by vote of the Council.

Amy Watt gave a presentation on the Pedestrian Safety Project that she has been working on with the Ag Instructor and students to make our crosswalks around town safer. They have proposed implementing flags stations at major crosswalks. They brought two proto-types to show the Council. The ag class would make these hoping to get donations to help with the costs. The Council congratulated them on the excellent presentation and gave the go ahead to make them. It was moved by Bezdicek and seconded by Smick.

Dan Cunningham discussed with the Council about wanting to buy the property on the corner of North Park St. and Short Street. He asked that the Council would consider cutting back on the set back requirements so he can build a home to sell. He was asked to stake out where he wants to build the home so the Council could see. They would then make a decision. He also wants to buy a lot in the Pleasant Valley Subdivision to build a single-family home. Before granting him a building permit, he was asked to get a signed sale agreement between him and the property owner. He also needs to submit a plot map.

The Clerk reported that the City received a \$14,285.26 incentive payment from Avista for the solar project.

The Clerk also reported that a property owner in town inquired about getting water rights to drill a well. This question needs to be directed to the Dept. of Ecology.

Mayor Webb reported on the abandoned car on Main Street. The towing company reported that they would have to charge us over \$300.00. It was felt that since this car had been on

personal property originally, the City is not responsible to having it towed. The home owner will be notified.
