Resolution # 441X a resolution of the town of St john, Washington, declaring an emergency relating to the pump at well #1, St john, Washington, and waiving the public bidding requirements of rcw 57.08.050 to perform the replacement of the pump and repairs of the well was passed with a motion from Smith and seconded by Bezdicek.

Resolution #442X a resolution of the town of St john, Washington, announcing the intent to file an application for federal financial assistance with the us department of agriculture, rural development was signed from the motion by Smick seconded by Hinds from the Feb 28, 2022 meeting to proceed with the application process.

Resolution # 443X a resolution of the town of St john, Washington, adjusting the common boundary between the two parcels of land owned by Rodriquez and Jessen was passed with a motion from Smith and seconded by Bezdicek.

The Town of Malden shared a letter from Whitman County Department of Public Works with the council. This letter stated that the International Residential Code and State Law, RCW 35.21.684 and RCW 36.01.225 state that RV's can only be used as a permanent residence if sited within a Mobile Home Park or an RV Park. This information will be used at a later date.

Spring clean-up contracts with Empire Disposal and Sutton Salvage are in process. Still waiting for list of Students from the school to help in community collection. After Spring Clean-Up week, the council will compile a list of residents that will receive letters to clean up to follow

Mayor reported that resident at 4 W Short was working on getting abandoned vehicle off the premises and doing a little clean up.

No request for additional comments were stated and it was moved by Mayor Webb, seconded, and unanimously agreed to adjourn. The Meeting was adjourned at 7:05 PM.
